

Need for the Workshop

Cerebral Palsy is the most common and complex Neuro developmental disability seen and managed by Physiotherapists in Special Schools and Rehabilitation Centers. Cerebral Palsy has a gamut of associated conditions which makes it complex and the management more challenging for the parents and physiotherapists.

The role of Physiotherapy is as diverse as the disability itself. Therefore the significance of physiotherapy at every stage- early childhood, Childhood, Adolescent, Adulthood, Middle age and Geriatric stage, is different and has a compounding effect on the life span of a person with CP. For example, during Infancy, the emphasis is on developing the gross motor skills which will chart the trajectory of future development.

Similarly, during childhood and adolescence, the focus is on strengthening functional mobility, including positioning, transitional movements, use of assistive devices, adaptations at home and community etc. During the Geriatric stage, Quality of care takes precedence and the focus would be to reduce sores, stress and pain alleviation for the person with CP as well as the caretakers.

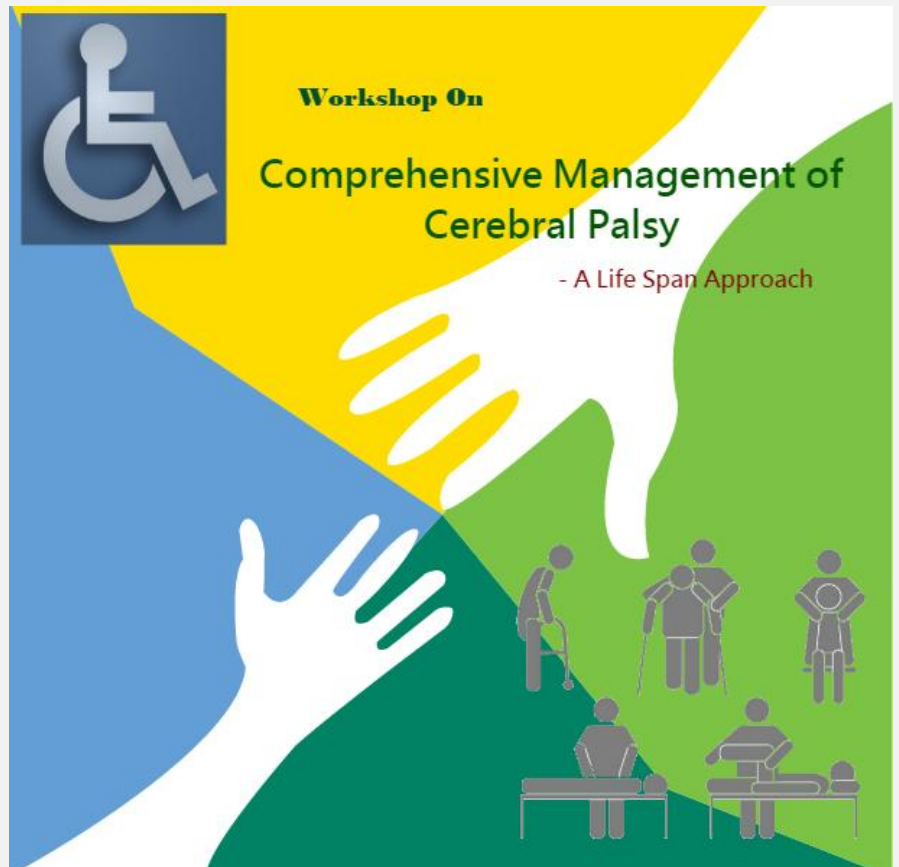
