About the Institution

Background of the National Conference

Inclusive Education is the new approach in the present educational system all over the world which aims at bringing all learners with diverse needs under one roof. Educational opportunities are provided to all children regardless of their gender, ethnic/social origin, language, religion, nationality, economic condition, ability etc. Ensuring that each individual has an equal opportunity for educational progress remains a challenge worldwide. 'Sustainable Development Goal 4 on Education and the Education 2030 Framework for Action' emphasize inclusion and equity as laying the foundations for quality education.

Adapted Physical Education (APE) is the art and science of developing, implementing, and monitoring a carefully designed physical education instructional program for a learner with a disability, based on a comprehensive assessment, to give the learner the skills necessary for a lifetime of rich leisure, recreation, and sport experiences to enhance physical fitness and wellness. APE also enhances the socio-emotional skills of the individual that helps him in holistic development.

The ultimate goal of any education should develop the learner in the 21st century skills which are considered as the matter of concern and need for the hour. These 21st century skills are a set of abilities that students need to develop in order to succeed in the information age. Each 21st Century skill is broken into one of three categories; Learning skills, Literacy skills and Life skills. Learning skills (Critical thinking, Creativity, Collaboration & Communication) teaches students about the mental processes required to adapt and improve upon a modern work environment. Literacy skills (Information, Media and Technology) focuses on how students can discern facts, publishing outlets, and the technology behind them. There's a strong focus on determining trustworthy sources and factual information to separate it from the misinformation that floods the Internet. Life skills (Flexibility, Leadership, Initiative, Productivity and Social skills) take a look at intangible elements of a student's everyday life. These intangibles focus on both personal and professional qualities. The development of these skills is necessary for all learners which includes students with disabilities also. Inclusive education embedded with the APE activities help to address the needs of all learners with diverse needs and to develop the 21st century skills.
